Issue#19 - Inner-view with Anthony Browder. This was the beginning of a now 20 year relationship with the Master Historian and Author.

MARCH 1, 1995
Issue#22 - Inner-view with Sister Souljah

AUGUST 1, 1994
Issue#14 - Da Ghetto Tymz magazine, DGT for short, debuts as a national publication.

JANUARY 1, 1996
Issue#33 - First Series written by M'Bwebe, 'IZ YT Hueman? or Mutant!'
• DaGhettoTymz.com's internet premiere

JUNE 1, 1996
Started DGT Outlet.Store.

MAY 1, 1995
Issue#25 - Inner-view with Dr. Naim Akbar

JULY 1, 1997
Issue#50 - Our first change to glossy cover layout and first double-issue.

OCTOBER 1, 2000
Issue#75 - move to eco-friendly recycled newspaper format.

APRIL 1, 2002
DGT becomes one of the first publicationz to offer Back Issues on CD.

MARCH 1, 2003
Issue#99 - First piece from our Metaphysics Frequencies Series vault, 'What Frequency R U On?'

APRIL 10, 2003
DGT celebrated its first decade and 100th issue and first Interactive CD Project.

JUNE 1, 2006
Issue#114 - Last print edition of DGT. DGT Digital beginz August 1, 2008.

SEPTEMBER 9, 2010
Versus Series debuts. Pitting HIS-story against OUR-story, this series was created to give a historical comparison to thingz, beliefs, cities, and urban legendz, that actually have an Afrikan root.

20th Anniversary

FEBRUARY 11, 2013
M'Bwebe releases 3rd book and 1st eBook, 'Urban Unrest: Slavery in New York'

APRIL 9, 2008
DGTv Season 2 released with VAs: 'The Riddle of Her Em Akhet', 'Canola Oil: A Drop of Death', and 'White Sugar: The Mark of Cane'. Season 1&2 was later released on DVD.

AUGUST 5, 2007
M'Bwebe publishes and releases first book, 'Analitikul Cogitationz'.

AUGUST 1, 2008
DGT Digital debuts as a web-friendly flip-page magazine.

JUNE 1, 2011
DGT created DGTeez, a line of t-shirts that embrace the Pan-Afrikan/Nile Valley lifestyle. Today we have nearly 50 designs in over 100 styles—and counting!

OCTOBER 18, 2013
Slated release of M'Bwebe's 4th book, 'The Unknown-Known: Enduring the Seldom Quest of Questionz', a book going deeper on the topic's spirituality and metaphysics.

SEPTEMBER 1, 2012
R.E.A.D. (Restore Education of the Afrikan Diaspora) Campaign. To increase literacy and cultural awareness among Afrikan people, R.E.A.D. an article every day for the month of September; "30 Days, 30 Articles".

APRIL 10, 2009
DGTv Season 3 released with VAs: 'T.I.M.E.: The Inner Mind's Eye', 'White Sugar2: Killin' You Sweetly', 'Numerical Mystereez', and 'The Classified Origin of D.C.'

JANUARY 5, 2006
DGTv Season 1 debuts with 4 Video Articles: 'Secret In the City', 'The Secret Behind the Truth About Cigarettes', 'The God Complex', and 'The Biochip'.

MARCH 1, 2004
Nebulation Studios releases M'Bwebe's 2nd full-length DVD: 'Afrikan Spirituality: the Microcozm of the Macrocozm'.

SEPTEMBER 11, 2002
M'Bwebe's first full-length DVD, 'The Metaphysical Repercussionz to the World Trade Center Bombing' released.

JANUARY 8, 2004
DGT D'Zynz changed to Nebulation Studios with M'Bwebe serving as lead designer.

OCTOBER 1, 2001
Issue#84 - 9/11 Terrorist Factory 6-Part Series debuts. 2011 turned into M'Bwebe's 2nd book.

MARCH 1, 1996
Issue#35 - The Boule' Series debuts. This topic took DGT into the field of conspiratorial organizationz founded by non-Afrikan for Afrikan people.

JANUARY 1, 1998
Issue#57 - The article 'IZ Islam 4 Afrikanz?' released sparking our first cyber debate.

APRIL 10, 1998
Birth of NTR-Prizes, parent of DGT, DGTv, Nebulation Studios, and M'Bwebe's lectures.

FEBRUARY 9, 1995
M'Bwebe began sharing his message at speaking engagements in Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, and New York.

SEPTEMBER 9, 1995
Issue#29 - After attending a few of his lectures, DGT was granted an Inner-view with Master Futurologist and Boule' Buster, Steve Cokely, "Check!"

OCTOBER 1, 1994
Issue#17 - First Inner-view with KRS-One & Channel Live.

APRIL 10, 1993
Founder, M'Bwebe Ishangi started putting his thoughts on paper and submitted to several major national "Black" publicationz. The negative response he received inspired him to develop a newsletter, Ghetto Tymz. The first issue was 5 pages on green paper with one staple in the upper left corner.
